Story of Shujon Roy

Shujon's family came to Ashulia four years ago from the village of the district of Rangpur for searching job or better income.



Shujon got admitted in class K.G. At present, he is 11 years old and studying in class 4. His father's name is Shree Dilip Roy and mother's name is Dipali Rani Roy. The family consists of five members. Shujon's elder brother is a tailor and his elder sister is married. His father and mother both work in garments factory. Their family income is about 10000 Taka (USD 128) per month. Shujon come to know about the school from a neighboring student who is studying in the school.

Shujon gets uniform, shoes, bag, study materials and midday meal regularly from the school. His future goal is to be a pilot. He goes to school and receives his lessons as well as moral lessons regularly.

Previously, he was very weak in study, but after getting admission in HOPE school the weakness has been reduced and improved with the support of his teachers. Now he studies hard. He tries to participate in all activities as per curriculum.
