younger sister. She reads in class K.G. in the same school. Her father is a mechanic and her mother works in a garment factory. Their family income is about 10,000 Taka (USD 128) per month. She is serious about her studies. She tries to participate in all activities as per curriculum.

She gets uniform, shoes, Bag, study materials and midday meal regularly. She wants to be a doctor in future.

Previously, she was very weak in Math but after getting admission in HOPE School the weakness has been reduced and with the help of her hard work and the support of her teachers. She conveys her thanks and gratitude to all.
